MESSAGE FROM DR DANNY JORDAAN

President of the South African Football Association

It is four years since the last CAF Women's Africa Cup of Nations (WAFCON) was hosted by Ghana after the 2020 edition had to be cancelled due to the pandemic. In 2018 Banyana Banyana collected silver medals in Accra thereby securing their maiden berth for the FIFA Women's World Cup France 2019™.

Significantly Banyana Banyana beat Nigeria 1 - 0 in the Group B opening match - their first victory over the Super Falcons since 2012. In so doing South Africa became the first team to beat the 10-time defending champions in their first match of the African Championship and the first team to prevent them from scoring a goal on day one. Unfortunately Banyana Banyana lost to Nigeria on penalties in the Final but a chink in the armour of our nemesis was opened and it won't be closing any time soon.

Once again we begin our WAFCON campaign with an encounter against the Super Falcons but in the meantime we have notched up another victory over Nigeria in their own backyard at the inaugural 2021 Aisha Buhari Cup. That resounding 4 - 2 defeat was our biggest ever victory over the Super Falcons as was our 3 - 0 defeat of Ghana's Black Queens in the same tournament.

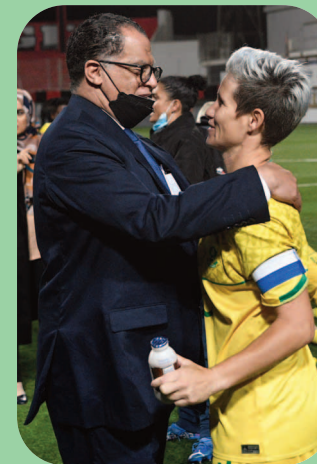
Women's football today is an unstoppable force on the world's sporting stage and Africa is primed and pumped to seize initiatives and forge ahead. This is the first edition of the continental championship to feature 12 teams instead of the previous 8 and we welcome Burkina Faso, Burundi, Botswana and Togo who are all making their debuts at this tournament. The top 4 teams here will automatically qualify for the 9th FIFA Women's World Cup in Australia and New Zealand next year (the first edition to have two host nations), and 2 more teams will advance to the inter-confederation play-offs. This is a substantial increase from the 3 slots previously allocated to Africa in line with it being the first time that 32 instead of 24 teams will compete at the Women's World Cup.

The tremendous success of last year's inaugural CAF Women's Champions League (won in spectacular fashion by our very own Mamelodi Sundowns Ladies FC) was such that CAF has introduced an innovative ground-breaking club licensing statute. As part of empowering the girl child, improving women's club football and advancing its professionalism on the African continent, CAF has resolved that men's clubs which do not have female teams will not be allowed to participate in future continental club competitions from the 2022/23 season. Boosting women's professional leagues on the continent will go hand in hand with the increasing number of African women signing lucrative contracts in the United States, the Far East and Europe. South Africa currently has over 30 players overseas, the two most notable being Thembi Kgatlana with Spanish Primera División club Atlético Madrid and Refiloe Jane turning out for AC Milan in the Italian Serie A Women's League.

Congratulations to our Head Coach Desiree Ellis (two-time CAF Women's Coach of the Year) who was recently selected as a Mentor in the 2nd FIFA Coach Mentorship Programme. In the first edition of the programme she was a mentor to two coaches from Sudan and Uganda. And last year she was named to a 21-person FIFA Technical Advisory Group to focus on the growth and advancement of women's football. The honours don't stop!

Sasol, there are never enough words to express our thanks for all that has been achieved in women's football across South Africa with you by our side since 2009. This particular crown is the one that has eluded Banyana Banyana and we would like nothing better than to bring the title home to you and all Banyana Banyana's fans. What a boon this trophy would be to all our future endeavours with the Senior National Team and in the Sasol Provincial League.

For young school girls playing football today, to know that one day they could earn a very good living playing professionally at home or abroad, become an African champion (club or national team), and even play on the world's greatest stage in front of hundreds of thousands of fans; this is the happy reality of women's football right here, right now. To everyone in Morocco, embrace this reality and make the most of the countless, wonderful opportunities opening up for all of you.

It is an honour for me and the rest of the team to be representing South Africa at the 2022 Women's Africa Cup Nations (WAFCON) as we know and fully understand what a huge responsibility it is that we have been given to fly the flag in Morocco.

This is the 14th edition of the tournament and we are also making our 13th appearance at this very important woman's continental football showpiece – and this speaks volumes about Banyana Banyana.

The last time this competition was held in 2018, we finished in second position and our aim remains doing the best we possibly can to improve on that result.

In our Group C we face the defending champions and nine-time winners Nigeria as well debutants Burundi and Botswana.

We will have to bring our A game to the tournament and start on a positive note with Nigeria in our opening match.

Banyana Banyana have played neighbours Botswana numerous times, so we are well aware of their capabilities – our loss to them in the 2020 Olympic Qualifiers where we failed to score over two legs and lost on a penalty shoot-out is well documented.

We also know the quality of Burundi who clinched second place in the 2022 CECAFA Senior Women's Championship earlier this month in Njeru, Uganda.

Our Group looks easy on paper – but then again, football is not played on paper – which simply means we have to work hard to achieve our goal.

The tournament as a whole offers the entire squad – technical team and staff members included – an opportunity to test ourselves against the best on the African Continent.

It is also another step to qualify for our second consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup, which will be held in Australia and New Zealand next year. In addition, we have a chance to go one better than our previous four finals and claim the elusive WAFCON gold medal.

Let me take this opportunity to thank the South African Football Association (SAFA) and our amazing sponsor Sasol for entrusting me with this truly momentous task of leading this amazing group of players and staff. And our greatest gratitude also goes to our wonderful fans for their support.

We will make the country proud!
